CATCH UP PROVISION SEPTEMBER 2021

We are providing a range of catch up interventions and opportunities this year at Kingshill School. We have also increased the number of homework clubs running in the library after school to 3 nights a week. Mr Whight will be available to supervise pupils that wish to make use of the IT equipment after school, please can pupils check with Mr Whight first.

Design Technology groups are running after school for specific courses, where lockdown slowed the amount of practical work that could be done. Our Extend programme also includes a range of subjects including PE, Drama and Music.

Faculties have been busy identifying potential gaps in curriculum knowledge that may have developed over the lockdowns, and are re-writing their curriculum where required to ensure the most important aspects have priority.

Following a successful launch last year with our current Y8 pupils, we are running mindfulness sessions for all Y7 classes, to assist our whole school drive on supporting pupils' mental health and wellbeing.

We have been monitoring and assessing reading, writing and spelling in Y7, 8 and 9 and are running inschool support for those who we feel would benefit from extra help. Further support for Key Stage 4 pupils with their examination subjects will be starting later in the Autumn term.

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COVID-19 VACCINATIONS FOR 16/17 YEAR OLDS

The Government have provided details on how 16 and 17 year olds are able to book their COVID-19 vaccination. This can be done online, by finding a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site, or by calling 119 if you are unable to book an appointment online. To continue to help school run safely, we would ask that you continue to test your child with a Lateral Flow Device Test twice weekly. More test kits will be handed out in tutor time next week for pupils that require them.

UNIFORM

As we are now well into the new school year, please can I remind parents about the school's uniform policy. As the weather starts to turn and get colder, pupils are reminded to wear their school jumper and blazers to school. Hoodies and any other form of jumper are not permitted. Government guidelines currently recommend that all windows and doors are left open to help with ventilation. We have advised teachers that as the weather gets colder, coats may also need to be worn.
