Stroud College Taster Day

Each year Stroud College offer the opportunity to attend a 'taster day' to students from schools who may consider the college as an option post 16. Cirencester Kingshill take Year 10's as part of our aspirations activities. It is our ambition to inspire Year 10 students earlier in their GCSE journey in order that they can understand the choices available to them and the grades they need to achieve in order to secure their futures. The Taster Day provides the opportunity for students to find out more about Stroud College as an option, but also to experience college life in general, and several courses that they may be considering post 16 (whether at Stroud College or not). This year, 16 students from Cirencester Kingshill attended the Taster Day and completed taster lessons is subjects ranging from art (various), plumbing, construction, games design, forensics and criminology, hairdressing, makeup, childcare, animal care, sustainable futures, business and more!

Our students said:

'It was really beneficial for younger people to think about their career'

'It was great to experience how the teachers spoke to you and to understand' (teachers are addressed by their first names at college)

'It was good to find out that there are extra clubs for the curriculum at college so you still get support and help that you need'.

Everyone felt they were more likely to follow a route to college post 16 after the experience, and 15 out of the 16 students would specifically be considering Stroud College. Everyone felt it was a positive experience that inspired them to start considering their future plans.

The Kingshill students represented our school extremely well especially since they were mixing with students a year older than themselves. They took responsibility for themselves and were respectful at all times. Well done to all – we are proud of you.

FSM Vouchers – Christmas Holidays

For the Christmas school holiday period, Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) will provide families in receipt of Free School Meals, who sign up to their offer, with 1 week of vouchers to assist with food costs during the school holidays which will complement the Holiday Activity and Food programme (HAF) taking place over the Christmas Holidays. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received and is separate to that of term time free school meals. The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (income-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire.

Families who have signed up previously do not need to re-register for December 2023 holiday vouchers - they will already have been included. Families that have previously signed up will need to contact us with any changes to their circumstances. To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can. If you have any updates to an existing application, please email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk so that they can update your details, as this is not an automatic process.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal vouchers for the Christmas holiday are open from midday 28th November until midday 12th December. Voucher emails will be sent out week commencing 18th December. Please remember to check their junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there. If you have not received their vouchers by 20th December, please email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk.

Please note GCC check eligibility for the scheme by cross-referencing with the term-time free school meal register, so please make sure you are registered beforehand.
