Charity fundraising a huge success

It has been a successful year of fundraising for the pupils of Cirencester Kingshill School with pupils having raised money for both Sport Relief and the chosen school charity.

Each year, pupils from each tutor group present during assembly to bid for their proposed charity to be selected as the school charity for the academic year. Pupils vote within their year group and then a charity per year group is put to a final vote with the whole school taking

part. From the five charities submitted this year, the Cheltenham based Suicide Crisis received the highest number of votes and was therefore selected.

Pupils have been raising money across the year, doing bake sales, selling sweets and during the hotter months we've had a selection of ice pops to cool us down. Due to the hard work of the staff and pupils to make these sales a success, we have so far raised £1017.17p for the school charity. This is a fantastic achievement and doesn't

include money that will be raised at the Charity Fair on Monday 23rd July 2018.

Sport Relief fundraising took place across a whole week in March and the Physical Education Faculty worked with the pupils to raise a huge amount of money. Further details of this can be found inside the newsletter on page 12.

Change of Parents' Evening times

Parents' Evenings have been reviewed this year due to increased demand for appointments.

As a consequence all Key Stage 3 Parents' Evenings will be three hours in length from September 2018.

For the forthcoming academic year Key Stage 4 will remain two hours and thirty minutes in length, as Years 10 and 11 are smaller year groups, but will extend to three hours from September 2019.

All Parents' Evenings will be held between 4:00pm and 7:00pm for Years 7, 8 and 9 and between 4pm and 6:30pm for Years 10 and 11 from September 2018.

News from the Chair of Governors

Since the last newsletter in March it has been a busy period for governors. Meetings which have taken place include:

- Full Governing Body – March and May
- Curriculum and Pastoral Committee – March and June
- Finance Committee – April and June
- Staffing Committee – April and June
- Buildings, Health and Safety Committee – April and June

Chairs of the above committees also meet as necessary in order to co-ordinate the work of the Governing Body.

Besides the committee work, individual governors are linked to faculties, the pastoral system, ICT administration, careers advice and safeguarding. Governors also sit as panels for pay review, pupil disciplinary and disciplinary hearings. A governor is always included on the interview panel when appointing new members of staff.

Full Governing Body

At its meeting in March the Governing Body welcomed newly elected Parent Governors Claire Cleaver and Rene Blamey. We also welcomed the newly elected Teacher Governor Sebastian Thomas. The main item of business was the Head's Report, a wide ranging document covering all aspects of the life of the school.

At its meeting in May the Governing Body welcomed newly elected Parent Governor David Walklett. The main items of business were presentations from:

- Duncan Evans (IT Administrator) regarding the impact upon the school of the General Digital Protection Regulations (GDPR).
- Gill Cannon (Head of SEND) and Jeremy Morland (Senior Assistant Head teacher) on the work of the Special Educational Needs Faculty.

Curriculum and Pastoral Committee

The Committee is advised by the Senior Leadership Team. At its meeting in March the Committee reviewed policies on educational visits, home-school agreements, physical restraint and safeguarding whistleblowing. Also discussed were the new careers' guidance regulations and the Ofsted data analysis of the school's performance.

Policies on pupil attendance, data protection, supporting pupils with medical needs, discipline and behaviour, assessment and reporting, access to the school for further education/training providers and high achievers (i.e. gifted and talented pupils) were reviewed at its meeting in June. The Committee also received reports on the Year 9 options choices and an update on safeguarding regulations.

Finance Committee

The Committee is advised by Sarah Gardiner (Business Manager). It receives monthly reports on the school's expenditure versus budget and considers any other matters affecting the school's finances. At the meeting in April the Committee reviewed policies on charging and remission, and risk management. The Committee also considered changes to the Academies' Financial handbook and the financial aspects of new contracts for catering and cleaning.

Buildings, Health and Safety Committee

The Committee is advised by Sarah Gardiner (Business Manager), Mark Hill (Site Manager), Duncan Evans (IT Administrator) and Alan Stone (Associate Governor).

The meetings in April and June reviewed policies on health and safety and the school minibus. There were also discussions about the school's heating system, the new cleaning contract, the new grounds maintenance contract, the new catering contract and the condition of the perimeter road.

Staffing Committee

The Committee is advised by Sarah Gardiner (Head of Personnel). The meetings in April and June reviewed policies dealing with allegations and abuse against staff, recruitment, parental complaints, the performance of teachers, flexible working, staff sickness absence, staff attendance, professional development and staff expenses. Also discussed was the staff gender balance.

Scholars' Programme 2018, The Brilliant Club

Our new cohort of The Brilliant Club pupils attended the launch of their Scholars' Programme at Warwick University on Tuesday 20th March 2018. The day began in the lecture theatre where all participating schools were introduced to the aims of the course and given a study skills session to help them with their forthcoming work.

In the next session, the pupils were treated to a tour of the modern campus led by student ambassadors. The university covers 1.2 square miles, has four faculties (arts, science, social science and medicine) and there are 32 separate departments. The pupils got a good sense of the scale of the place, the range of subjects to choose and the facilities offered, such as the library (with over a million books), the theatre and the sports centre.

There was a talk about university life by the Student Ambassadors, where pupils could ask any questions about courses, finances or even things like 'can I bring a pet with me?' Pupils found this part of the day useful, as it answered a lot of things for them about attending university.

The pupils met their PhD tutor and were

introduced to the assignment topic they would be studying. They were also set their first piece of homework which had to be submitted by the end of the Easter holiday.

They will have weekly meetings in school with their tutor, where he will set them work to prepare them for submission of their final essay in June 2018.

The pupils completed a Scholars' Programme Prediction form which will be discussed at the graduation event later this year about their thoughts and expectations of the Brilliant Club programme.

Cirencester Kingshill School Expressive Arts Faculty presented Billy Elliot the Musical (Monday 9th July until Thursday 12th July 2018). The Kingshill production was directed by Ms E. Stones, Teacher of Drama with choreography from Mrs K. Bates (Cirencester Creative Dance Academy) and music direction from Mr J. Driver, Head of Music. Set in a northern town during the miners' strike of 1984/5, the show follows Billy's journey from boxing ring to ballet class where he discovers a passion for dance that unites his family, inspires his community and changes his life forever. Success in Mathematics Challenges

Each year a selection of pupils from Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10 take part in the Junior and Intermediate mathematics challenges. Over 250,000 pupils from across the country take part in each challenge with roughly the top 6% receiving a gold certificate, the next 13% silver and the next 21% bronze.

Lea Woods - Year 9 Teambuilding Days

On Monday 11th June and Monday 18th June 2018, we took 2 groups of pupils to Lea Woods for a day of learning in the great outdoors. The site is run by the Ernest Cook Trust and is part of the 4200 acre Fairford Park Estate.

The first task of the day was orienteering: the pupils split into small teams and were sent off into the woods with their maps. Each team was given a sheet of target markers where they would find equipment essential for their survival in the great outdoors: string, kindling, a potato peeler (all will become clear later), water and most important of all some food (a small bag of marshmallows).



After break, the next task was to build a water filter using an old plastic bottle, cotton wool, charcoal, sand and gravel. The pupils poured their muddy pond water into the filters and were surprised at how clear the water came out after filtering. They were very relieved that we were not actually going to make them drink the water though.

Next came den building using piles of logs scattered around the main clearing. They could build whatever they wanted but their dens had to be large enough for the whole team to safely get into. There were some fantastic creations and everybody joined in collecting the logs and deciding how their dens should take shape.

The final activity involved pupils cutting a willow branch each and whittling these to a point with their potato peelers. The instructor then demonstrated how to safely build a fire and everyone toasted lots of marshmallows; quite a few of them were convinced that the blacker the marshmallow was, the tastier it would be!

All the pupils threw themselves into the activities and worked very well together. It was a pleasure working with them and spending the day outside in such a beautiful setting.
