News from the Chair

of Governors

Since the last Newsletter, Governors have met on the following occasions:

- Full Governing Body 19th January 2023 and 9th March 2023
- Curriculum and Pastoral Committee 12th January 2023 and 7th March 2023
- Finance, Audit and Risk Committee 2nd February 2023
- Buildings and Health and Safety 25th January 2023
- Staffing Committee 11th January 2023
- Chairs Committee 16th February 2023

All the above meetings were held online except for the Full Governing Body Meetings which took place in school.

Full Governing Body

The meeting in January was immediately preceded by the Annual General meeting of Cirencester Kingshill School, the annual accounts were received and adopted together with the directors' report and auditors report on those accounts.

At the Full Governing Body meeting of the 19th January 2023, two presentations were made to the meeting:

- Mr Hamblin gave a presentation about the work of the Physical Education faculty.
- Mr Lee gave a presentation about the work of the English faculty.

Approval was given for a cross-faculty trip for Spanish and Expressive Arts to go to Barcelona in March 2024.

Policies for Child Protection and Special Educational Needs and Disabilities were approved.

The principal item at the Full Governing Body meeting of the 9th March 2023 was the Head's report, which provided Governors with details of the work of the school since the previous such report that was presented in October 2022. The draft Ofsted Action Plan was also discussed and approved.

Curriculum and Pastoral Committee

Across the 2 meetings policies reviewed annually included:

- Exclusion of Pupils
- Mental Health and Wellbeing
- Collective Worship
- Community Cohesion
- Anti-bullying
- Pupil Premium
- Substance Misuse
- Teaching and Learning
- Educational Visits
- Physical restraints
- Safeguarding Whistleblowing

The meetings were updated over the current positions regarding Safeguarding and SEND and the SEND draft Action Plan was presented and discussed.

The meetings also received reports on Mathematics, English, Science, Humanities, Pastoral and Safeguarding. There was also discussion of the KS4 options being offered to current Y9 pupils.

Finance, Audit and Risk Committee

The committee reviewed the monthly outturn vs budget statements for September 2022 to December 2022. The Best Value Statement, Investment Policy and Lettings and Hiring Policy were approved. Various reports relating to the performance of the school were discussed including Balance and Reserves at Year end 2021-22, Key Performance Indicators, School Resource Management Self-assessment and Dashboard, 2022 Actuarial Valuation and a Benchmarking Overview. The Risk Register was reviewed, and updates provided on the Cleaning and Catering contracts.

Buildings and Health & Safety Committee

The committee discussed the GEMS (Good Estate Management for Schools) self-assessment process. Further areas under discussion included Capital Grants to help with energy efficiency, a heating update on the condition of our boilers, the School Bungalow and its renovation and the CCTV and Paxton systems around the school.

Staffing Committee

Ms Stones gave a presentation on mental health and wellbeing for staff and pupils across the school.

Policies reviewed annually included those for:

- Maternity Leave, Paternity Leave and Shared Parental Leave (Adoption)
- Maternity Leave, Paternity Leave sand Shared Parental Leave (Birth)
- **Employee Capability**
- Whistle-Blowing Policy
- Pay Policy 2022-23

Teachers and Support Staff pay awards were discussed.

Governors were updated on Staffing in all areas across the school.

Chairs Committee

The agenda for the Full Governing Body meeting to be held on 9th March 2023 was approved, in addition to discussion of many of the items outlined above. The policy for Governor Visits to School was approved. The Scheme of Delegation was agreed. There was a discussion of admissions for September 2023 as well as various aspects related to Governors including vacancies, succession planning, role of faculty links and training.

As previously reported the Governors have been engaged in re-structuring the Governing Body into two new bodies — a Board of Trustees and a Board of Members. The Board of Trustees will continue with all the usual work of the Governing Body and will retain the same responsibilities that Governors have at present. The Board of Members will be independent of the Trustees and will not be involved in the day-to -day business of the school. They will scrutinize the work of the Board of Trustees and be responsible for appointing/ removing Trustees. We now intend to implement the change by the middle of May 2023.



Mathematics Poster Competition







Advances in Anesthesia Wins

Famelab School Final



Can photosynthesis happen in the dark? Do you understand Spaghettification? Why do we get scared?

These topics and more were all shared as part of the Kingshill School Final for FameLab Academy, a Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) competition, run by Cheltenham Festivals as part of its Science for Schools programme. This is our fourth year of taking part in the competition designed to develop communication skills and it was once again a huge success. All of Year 9 took part by preparing talks to present to their class. They gave a 2/3-minute presentation without notes or electronic visual aids and were judged on the content of the talk, the clarity of their story and their charisma and ability to engage the audience. The class then voted on their favourite talks and we ended up with our eight finalists.

The finalists and talks were:

- Emily H 'Different ways to treat animals'
- Faye D 'One food Process'
- Cerys L 'Spaghettification'
- Isabelle S 'Anesthetics and operations'

- Oliver K 'Energy'

The finalists were then judged by Faisal Jina, our linked STEM Mentor who works in the area of Artificial Intelligence, Mr. S. Pritchard, our Deputy Head and Mr. Thomas our Chair of Governors. It was an incredibly tough final with fantastic talks and the judges found it extremely difficult to select just one winner! However, they finally agreed to send Isabelle to represent Kingshill at the Gloucestershire School final. Isabelle used her own personal experience of anaesthetics to research the topic and her talk explored how they have developed over time. With the use of simple atomic models, she brought the topic to life and everyone agreed she was a worthy winner.





On Thursday 23rd March 2023, the Science Faculty and a

group of pupils went to support Isabelle in the Gloucestershire Schools final for FameLab Academy at The Rose Theatre, Tewkesbury. Isabelle did amazingly well and was the runner up in the competition. It was a great day getting to listen to talks from students across the county on a range of STEM subjects and take part in an event which promotes Science communication.

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Y9 Pupils Attend Climate Change Symposium

On Friday 3rd March 2023, ten students from year nine were chosen to represent the school in a Climate Change Symposium held at Rendcomb College. We started the day in the Griffin Theatre with a presentation about the BeyondCOP21 symposium. This has enabled children to contribute towards the future of climate change since the 2016 Paris Climate Change Agreement. We listened to an inspirational message from Bill McKibbin, a well-known American climate change speaker, informing us about the effects of climate change and what our generation can do to foresee a brighter, greener future. Later, we were shown a series of pictures displaying how climate change has affected the world, this motivated us to make a change and look after our planet with respect for generations to come.

After some fresh air, a guest speaker, the CEO of Whale and Dolphin Conservation, gave an interactive talk about how whales and dolphins positively impact the world and how we can help them and benefit from this. I found this lecture insightful as it taught us about the culture of these incredible mammals.

Before lunch, we started a carousel of activities and workshops. With pupils from other schools, we discussed and expressed our ideas for a sustainable, ideal, and positive future in various aspects of life. Following our appetising lunch, we looked into the life cycle of marine life and how the use of

plastic disrupts this cycle and affects the food chain. Furthermore we enjoyed a powerful exhibition where companies promoting sustainability gave us advice on how to be environmentally friendly. Finally we then returned to the Griffin Theatre and were educated about green particularly energy sources hydrogen batteries and electric cars.
