# **News from the Chair of Governors**

Since the last Newsletter, Governors have met on the following occasions:

Full Governing Body – 12<sup>th</sup> May 2022

Curriculum and Pastoral Committee – 21<sup>st</sup> June 2022

Finance, Audit and Risk Committee – 28<sup>th</sup> April 2022

Buildings and Health and Safety – 30<sup>th</sup> March 2022 and 16<sup>th</sup> June 2022

Staffing Committee – 27<sup>th</sup> April 2022 and 8<sup>th</sup> June 2022

Chairs Committee – 9<sup>th</sup> June 2022

All the above meetings were held online except for the Full Governing Body Meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> May 2022 which took place in school.

## **Full Governing Body**

Mr Whight Head of Computing, gave a presentation to the meeting in May on the Computing Curriculum. In the remainder of the meeting an update was given following the recent Health and Safety audit. Approval was given for the appointment of school auditors for 2022-23. This was Mr O'Hare, Chair of Buildings and Health and Safety, final Full Governing Body meeting, and he was thanked for his 9 years of service as a Governor.

## **Curriculum and Pastoral Committee**

Policies reviewed annually included Data Protection, School Discipline and Behaviour, Assessment and Reporting and High Achievers (Gifted and Talented). There was also discussion of the KS4 options being offered to current Y9 pupils.

## **Finance, Audit and Risk Committee**

The committee reviewed the monthly outturn against budget statements for January 2022 to April 2022. The Charging and Remission and Risk Management Policies were approved, as were the Financial Handbook and Risk Register. A variety of financial reports were considered including the Monthly Reports for January and February, The Supplementary Grant for 2022-23 and a review of the Budget for 2022-23. The renewal of the Catering Contract was discussed as was the audit tender process for the same.

## **Buildings and Health & Safety Committee**

Across the two meetings held by this committee the Health and Safety and Minibus Policies were approved. Updates were received on the Cleaning and Grounds Maintenance contracts, as well as the Health and Safety Audit, the automation of the Main Gates and the Fire Officer's visit. The committee were also informed that the Environmental Health Officer had visited the school kitchen on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2022, and had awarded the kitchen a 5-star rating. The Summer Works programme was also discussed.

## **Staffing Committee**

Across two meetings, this committee has approved a range of policies including those for Employees Capability, Probation Procedure, Staff Recruitment, Complaints, Performance Management and Flexible Working.

In both meetings, Governors were updated on Staffing in all areas across the school.

## Chairs Committee

In addition to discussion of many of the items outlined, the policy for Governor Development was approved. There were discussions of various aspects related to Governors including the agenda for the Full Governing Body meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2022, Governor vacancies and the dates for meetings during the next academic year.

In the April newsletter I outlined that, as a consequence of regulations for Academies (as laid down by the DfE, Department for Education), Governors have been engaged in discussions about re-structuring the Governing Body into two new bodies — a Board of Trustees and a Board of Members. This structure is now a requirement for all Academy Trusts. We had hoped to be able to implement this change this academic year, but continued delays in the processing of our submission mean that this will now probably not take place before October 2022 at the earliest.



***Year 6 Inductions days*** - We welcomed Year 6 pupils to Kingshill for an Induction day on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2022,. We had a few nervous children to start with but they soon settled in and enjoyed their time at the school making friends and doing lots of activities.

## Year 9 Trip – Leawood, Fairford

On Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> May 2022, 26 year 9 pupils had a day out at Leawood, Fairford. The site is run by the Ernest Cook Trust, who offer educational opportunities and experiences to schools.

The instructor Liz explained that they were here to learn survival skills if they ever found themselves out in the woods. The first task was orienteering where students were sent off in 6 groups, armed with a map and a list of marker posts they had to find. Around the woods staff had placed equipment such as empty bottles, potato peelers and marshmallows which would be used for the survival tasks; students also had to collect kindling and pond water.

After break the groups were set tasks of building a shelter using two 'Y' shaped sticks, a supporting pole, branches and leaves. They had to cut a hazel branch to cook their 'food' on the fire and they had to make a water filter using cotton wool, sand and gravel to clean their pond water.

The final task of the day involved whittling their hazel sticks with the potato peelers and toasting their foraged marshmallows in a fire pit constructed by the instructor. Some pupils were convinced that they needed to toast them until they were black!

All pupils threw themselves into the activities and worked very well together - it was a pleasure working with them and spending the day outside in such a beautiful setting – I hope everyone enjoyed the day and learnt something new.
