- Develop links with schools in different parts of the UK and abroad as the opportunities arise through these links.
- Welcome to our school teachers and pupils from other countries.
- Raise awareness of cross-cultural issues through joint projects.
- Encourage interest and motivation through the provision of first hand experiences of life in another country.

- Promote communication between pupils in different parts of the UK and abroad.
- Provide staff with development opportunities to compare different teaching and learning strategies.
- Raise awareness and appreciation of other environments and what is happening in the world.
- Develop cross-curricular activities with an international theme for all pupils.

To demonstrate our Commitment to the Global dimension Cirencester Kingshill School will:

- Continue to hold the International School Award and to ensure it is maintained by;
 - Reviewing the International Schools' Policy annually.
 - Carrying out an audit every two years which maps pupils' exposure to global cultural issues across Faculties and across Year groups.
