HE map shows the great North
European Plain that stretches from
the Atlantic Ocean to the Ural
Mountains in Russia. This huge area
of lowland has most of Europe's best
farmland, and many of the biggest cities.

To the north of the plain are the snowy mountains of Scandinavia. To the south are even higher mountains: the Pyrenees, the Alps and Carpathians, and the Caucasus Mountains. Southern Europe has hills and mountains by the Mediterranean Sea. The areas of lowland are carefully farmed.
